PLANNING TRAVEL TO NEW ZEALAND

This visa information guide includes some basic preparation and visa information to ensure that you can fulfil the entry requirements and processes for New Zealand and will contribute to your experience in New Zealand being positive and memorable.

Please note that the following content is provided for information only, all travellers must still meet their own individual entry and visa requirements relevant to their specific situation.

Note that if you are travelling on a passport from Australia or New Zealand (including New Zealand passports issued to nationals of the Cook Islands, Niue and Tokelau), you will not require a New Zealand Electronic Travel Authority (NZeTA) or visa prior to travelling.

We encourage people to continue to monitor the Immigration New Zealand (INZ) website www.immigration.govt.nz for any changes to the visa requirements for entering New Zealand, and updated information on any travel requirements for New Zealand.

IMMIGRATION AND VISA REQUIREMENTS

When planning your trip and before you leave, check to make sure you have all the travel documents you will need and that they are all up to date.

If you do not have the correct visa or travel authority when you check-in for your flight to New Zealand, you may not be able to board, or you may be refused entry on arrival in New Zealand. It is each traveller's responsibility to make sure you hold the correct visa or travel authority.

To travel to New Zealand, you will require prior permission from Immigration New Zealand. The visa you are eligible for depends on the passport you are travelling on and your main purpose for travel.

NEW ZEALAND ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORITY (NZeTA)

If you are travelling to New Zealand as a visitor and you hold a passport from a "visa waiver country" listed in [Appendix A](#) and on the INZ website: [Visa waiver countries and territories | Immigration New Zealand](#) and intending to stay for less than three months, you will be able to travel to New Zealand on an NZeTA and may be granted a visitor visa on arrival, subject to meeting standard entry requirements (which includes sufficient funds, onward travel arrangements, and being of acceptable health and character).

You can request an NZeTA online at least 72 hours before you travel: New Zealand Electronic Travel Authority (NZeTA) :: Immigration New Zealand

Note that you cannot undertake work activities while on an NZeTA. If you are travelling to New Zealand for work purposes such as, undertaking testing, maintenance, or providing technical support, you will need to apply for a [Specific Purpose Work Visa](#) before travelling.

VISA CATEGORIES

If you need to apply for a visa before you travel, the type of visa you apply for will depend on the type of event/visit you are attending, your participation, as well as your intended length of stay as noted in the table below.

APPLY FOR A GROUP VISA

If you are part of a group travelling in, and visiting New Zealand for the same purpose, and have a group leader organising the trip, contact your event organiser/host to consider applying for a Group Visitor Visa here: [Group Visitor Visa | Immigration New Zealand](#) to ensure your applications can be processed together.

FEES

People travelling under the visa waiver provisions who request an NZeTA will need to pay the NZeTA application fee. This fee includes the International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy. Information on fees for an NZeTA can be found here: [NZeTA](#)

Anyone who will be applying for a visa (visitor or work) will need to pay the visa application fee. Any facilitation fees charged by the Visa Application Centres will also require payment. APPLY IN GOOD TIME

Please ensure that visa applications are submitted well before your intended travel date. It is recommended you apply at least four weeks in advance. Please also ensure that you check whether your proposed travel route will require any transit visas and allow sufficient time to obtain these.

ONCE YOUR APPLICATION HAS BEEN SUBMITTED

Once your application has been submitted online you do not need to send us a physical copy of your passport. If we need to see your physical passport to confirm your identity, we will either email you after you submit your application or tell you on the acknowledgement page when you complete your online application. Do not send your physical passport to INZ unless you have been advised to by an INZ processing officer.



If your application is approved, you will be granted an electronic visa (eVisa) which will be uploaded on your Immigration ONLINE account. You must print this and carry it with you when you travel.

ESCALATION FOR URGENT VISA APPLICATIONS

INZ usually allocate applications for visas by the date we receive them, from the oldest first, which is why it is important to submit your application in at least four weeks in advance of your intended travel. When we allocate an application, it means we assign it to an immigration officer to start assessing it.

In some cases, you can make a request for urgent allocation. Your request must have a compelling or very important reason for your application to be allocated urgently. This includes:

- compelling personal and business circumstances
- humanitarian factors, and
- matters of national interest.

PASSPORT

To board your flight to New Zealand you need a valid passport or travel document. You may not be allowed to check in if your passport is not valid for travel to New Zealand. Check that your passport will not expire until:

- three months after the date you plan to leave New Zealand, or
- one month after the date you plan to leave New Zealand – if your passport was issued by a country that has a New Zealand embassy or consulate that issues passports of that country.

NEW ZEALAND TRAVELLER DECLARATION

Anyone travelling to New Zealand must complete a New Zealand Traveller Declaration (NZTD). The NZTD can be submitted up to 24 hours in advance of travel. This form is available on [www.travellerdeclaration.govt.nz](#). Passengers may choose between a web form and a mobile app. There are also paper declarations available for passengers on arrival for those unable to complete the digital declaration. This form is only required if you intend entering New Zealand. It is not required for transit passengers.

APPENDIX A

VISA WAIVER COUNTRIES AND TERRITORIES

Citizens of the following countries do not require a visa to travel to New Zealand but must hold an NZeTA (New Zealand Electronic Travel Authority), if they are visiting for three months or less, and as long as the purpose of the visit is for a lawful purpose as specified in immigration instructions.

APPENDIX B

CHECKLIST FOR EVENT ATTENDEES

If you have been invited to attend an event hosted in New Zealand, check if you are eligible to travel in on an NZeTA: <https://www.immigration.govt.nz/nzeta>

The visa you apply for will depend on the type of event you are attending and your participation within the event. Make sure you apply for the most appropriate visa at least four weeks before your intended travel. Immigration New Zealand may request further information.
